





Wireless Rules

- Must have antivirus installed
 - FREE at software.tamu.edu
- No illegal file sharing or inappropriate use
- Devices must not create a wireless signal including printers, routers and gaming systems



Your Residence Life Staff

Resident Advisor/Apartment Resident Advisor

A student staff member who lives in your facility on your ramp, wing, floor, or balcony, who builds community and supports you and your fellow residents.

Graduate Hall Director/Graduate Resident Manager

A graduate student who lives in your residence hall or apartment and is responsible for the overall management and community building within your residence hall.

Community Director/ Resident Manager

A full-time professional responsible for the overall management and community building within your residence life facility.

Residence Life Coordinator

A full-time professional who supervises several Community Directors and oversees a specific section within on campus living.



What does an RA do?

- RA's are students just like you!
- If you have a question, go see your RA.
- If you are having a tough day and need someone to talk to, go see your RA.
- If you have an emergency while in the Residence Hall, go see your RA.
- Don't know where to find something? Check with any RA.
- They are to assist and be a resource for you. When in doubt, check them out!



Policies you need to know: (no, this is not all of them)

- Escort, Visitation & Overnight Guests
- Quiet Hours and Courtesy Hours
- > Alcohol Use or Possession
 - > <u>All</u> residents must be 21 years of age to have and/or consume alcohol.
- > Abide by <u>all</u> federal and state laws and city ordinances <u>all</u> of the time.
- <u>Always</u> abide by all university student rules, regulations and policies.
- > Drug Use/Abuse and Drug Paraphernalia Possession
 - Residence hall rooms and apartments are not air tight (smell/odor) nor 100% soundproof. If you deal drugs or abuse them, it is <u>VERY</u> hard to hide in our tight-knit residence life communities. You may run the risk of no longer being an Aggie. You may want to think twice now about what habits you bring or start in Aggieland!



Concealed Carry – Texas A&M – College Station

- Concealed handgun license holders must follow all state and federal laws concerning owning and possessing a handgun on campus.
- > Any resident who:
 - is licensed to carry a concealed handgun
 - and chooses to bring the handgun into their residence hall room / apartment
 - must store the handgun and ammunition in a safe that has been rented or purchased through the Department of Residence Life when the handgun is not on or about their person.

What you <u>CAN</u> bring

- Toilet paper only supplied in community bathrooms
- ✓ Computer
- ✓ Shower caddy
- ✓ Academic supplies
- ✓ Decorations
- Laundry basket(s) or laundry bag(s)

Wax warmers ("scentsy-type") that use a 25 watt bulb in a ceramic container to heat scented wax are allowed, but should never be left unattended.

Things to know

- Consult with your roommate on appliances
- > 4.4 Cubic Feet Fridges/Freezer combo
- 700 Watt Microwave Oven (only 1 per room)
 White Creek- Only the microwave provided is allowed
- Micro Chill models available for rent
 It's a refrigerator/freezer/microwave combo
- Painting needs to be approved by hall staff <u>before</u> you <u>paint</u>.
 No painting allowed in Hullabaloo Hall, FHK Complex, or White Creek Apartments
- Use 3M Command Adhesive Strips/Hooks with a tab to hang items on walls/doors.

Community & Personal Safety

- > Do not allow <u>tailgaters</u> into the residence halls or apartments.
- Lock your doors
- Do <u>not</u> prop doors
- Report any suspicious people or negative activities to University Police (UPD) and your residence life staff <u>immediately</u>.




