5 Best Practices

- 1. Positive involvement leads to greater student success
- 2. Student is likely to reach out to you before a university resource
- 3. Communication with you about academic goals is positively correlated with student persistence
- 4. Families can be instrumental in supporting student well-being
- 5. Family's ability to support independence can lead to a sense of belonging in college

Transition Realities




