Classics

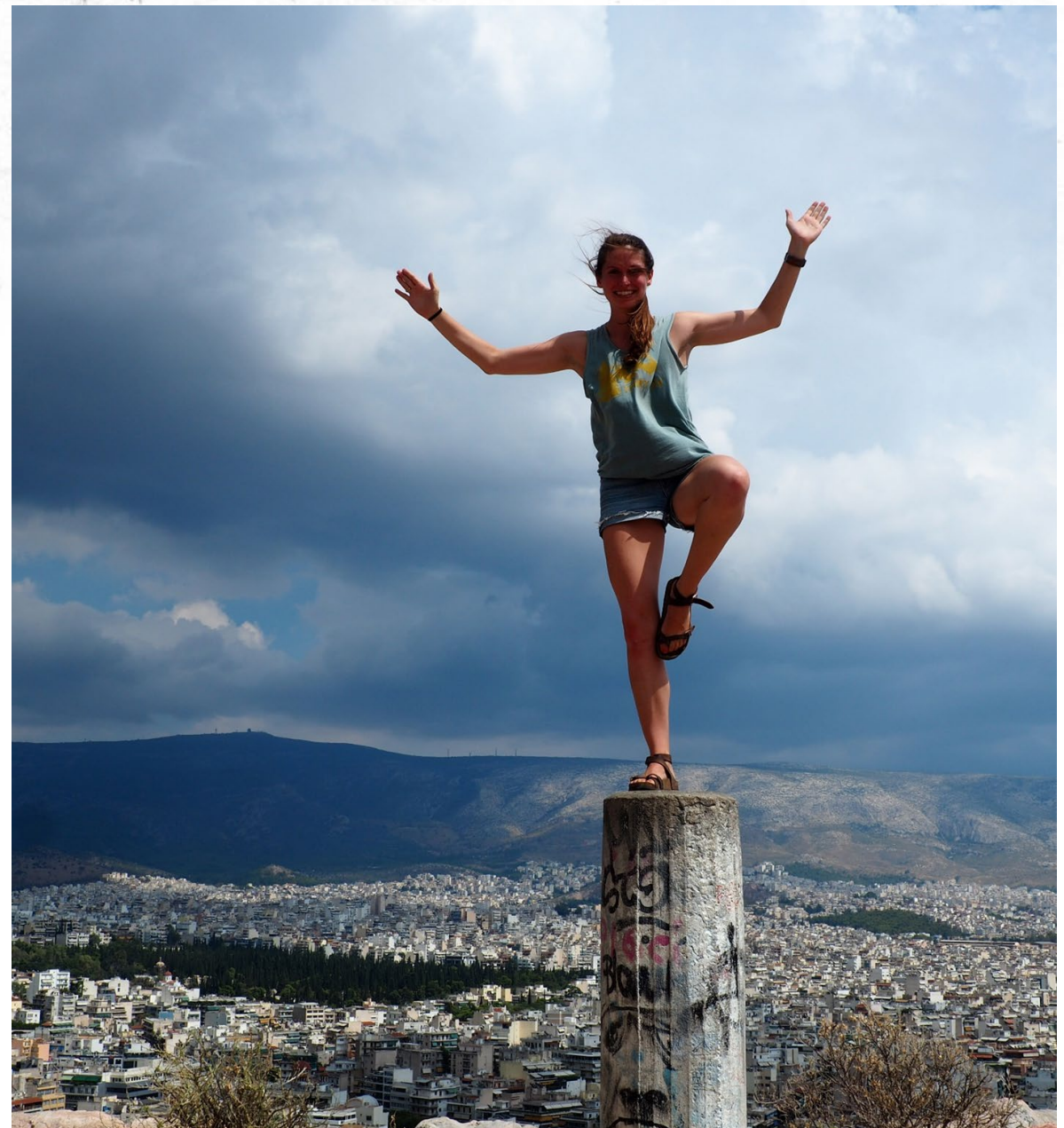
Classics is designed to give students a thorough **grounding in the culture, history, literature of Ancient Greece and Rome**. Studying the language, history, literature, and architecture of these civilizations develops student skills in close reading, writing, and critical thinking. Students examine and analyze ancient cultures and learn about how fundamental concepts of Western Civilization such as rationalism and democracy first arose in Classical Antiquity.

 - Ex. ANTH 316: Nautical Archaeology, PHIL 410: Classical Philosophy, CLAS 251: Classical Mythology
- Directed Electives II: (6 hours): Supporting Classical Civilization courses
 - Ex. ARCH 430: History of Ancient Architecture, CLAS 220: History of Christianity



CLASS MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY: LANGUAGE & LITERATURE

- CLAS 410 (3 hrs): Seminar in Classical Studies
- CLAS 491 (1 hr): Research in Classics
- Ancient Language Requirement (18 hrs): Greek or Latin
 - Both language requirements begin at Beginning Language II
- Directed Electives I (6 hrs)
 - Ex. ARCH 430: History of Ancient Architecture, CLAS 220: History of Christianity
- Directed Electives II (3 hours)
 - Ex. ANTH 316: Nautical Archaeology, PHIL 410: Classical Philosophy, CLAS 251: Classical Mythology



Modern Languages & Spanish Degree

Courses are designed to offer students **extended study of the language, literatures, media, and cultures** of these language communities. Courses include language skills for the professions, as well as in-depth studies of cultural topics, and national and transnational issues.

SPAN MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY

- Interdisciplinary Electives (9 hours)
 - Additional SPAN/HISP courses or courses that cover Spain or Latin America



INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS – GERM & SPAN ONLY

1. You must spend a **minimum of 10 consecutive weeks** in an approved study abroad, internship or volunteer (service-learning) experience. This could be completed during the fall, spring or summer. Your IE must have a cultural and language immersion component based on the language in which you will have proficiency.
2. You must be in good academic standing with the university.
3. You must complete (or test out of) **101, 102, 201, and 202** of the language. You must earn a grade of “C” or better in each of these courses.
4. Your IE must generate a minimum of 3 hours of approved academic credit.
5. Once approved for travel by the GLAC advising office, it is your responsibility to follow Texas A&M procedures for study abroad and transfer credit. In most cases this is done under the direction of the Study Abroad Office located in the Pavilion.
6. Experiences abroad prior to the completion of these requirements will not satisfy the IE requirement.

REGISTRATION TO DO LIST

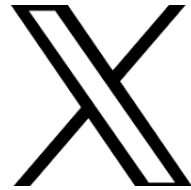
- Using the REGISTRATION WORKSHEET in Howdy, map out additional courses, keeping your pre-registered coursework in mind
- When making your schedule, check to see if:
 - Each class has enough available spots (if <5, find an alternative section as backup)
 - Each class fulfills a degree requirement (*attributes*)
 - Each section of each class doesn't have restrictions; if so, you pass those restrictions
 - You have fulfilled any prerequisites required
 - No class times conflict – the graphic scheduler (bottom left of the screen) will be helpful for this
- Save your Registration Worksheet and have it prepared to show the advisors when we come back after the break
- ***Be sure to have backups and more backups. If a class is full, you need to be able to move on immediately!***



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
