THE CORE CURRICULUM

State educational requirements for all undergraduates

- Communication
- Mathematics
- Life & Physical Sciences
- Foreign Language (Bachelor of Arts degrees)
- Language, Philosophy, & Culture
- Creative Arts
- Social & Behavioral Sciences
- Citizenship (Government + History)



UNIVERSITY DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Degree Programs Require 120 Hours (major colored sections of major sheets)

• 1 course cannot apply towards 2 degree requirements

International & Cultural Diversity (KICD) and Cultural Discourse (KUCD)

• 3 hours of each course type

Writing Intensive Courses (UWRT)

2 major courses must be designated as Writing Intensive when taken

Residency Requirement

 All students must take 36 hours of upper-level classes (300/400 level) taken at Texas A&M

Attributes of courses taken for major requirements can be applied to yellow areas.



ENHANCING YOUR DEGREE

Adding Requirements to Degree Completion:


- Minor(s) up to 2, generally before 90 hours (some programs sooner)
- Certificate Program additional curriculum, can complete primary degree requirements
- Second Major, Double Degree before 90 hours, with additional requirements
- Bachelors/Masters Combined Programs English, History, & Philosophy programs


