minimum of 18 hours of Honors coursework.



Registration Readiness Tab:


You will not be able to register if your **registration tasks** have not been completed or if you have **holds**.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

There are many questions that students and families have during the one-on-one advising meeting.

- AP Credit: Credit can be accepted at any time before graduation. We recommend not accepting course credit right away.
- Dual Credit: Start thinking about a minor if you are mostly core complete
- TRANS XXXX: If you believe that a course taken at another institution may count, the course syllabus can be submitted for review. The department's decision is final.
- "Hard" Classes: If you are thinking about professional school, science here (except PHYS)



ASK YOURSELF


