- Qualifies graduates to pursue a professional M.Arch program.







- Dear Sent From My Iphone, Please Include your name and UIN.
- Include Pertinent Information (Ex. Course section number, CRN number)
- Check Your Resources first, especially during peak times. (Ex. Transfer Course Equivalency, catalog.tamu.edu, Weekly Newsletter email)
- Allow an Appropriate Amount of Time for a response. Plan Questions and Research Potential Issues ahead of time.
- **Email is Not** a replacement for an appointment.




