



- Paid or unpaid

- 6 credit hours, graded as Pass/Fail
- 400 work hours during term of internship
- Each student secures their own internship
- Two online courses are planned with internship <u>IF</u> you need to be 12 hours in fall or spring (EHRD 405 & EHRD 477).
