NEW SPMT CURRICULUM

- This is a relatively NEW sport management curriculum than what you may have researched
- Designed by SPMT faculty with input from industry professionals, current students, and former students
- Degree requirements for you are extremely different than previous SPMT requirements
- Please do not go to other SPMT undergraduates with questions about your degree, as they will likely give you very incorrect information!

WHAT DOES THE WRITING ON MY DEGREE PLAN MEAN?

- 24A, B, or C: year and term course was taken; A = Spring, B = Summer, C = Fall
- CR or TCR: received credit from AP exam
- **CR** or **TCR**: Indicates you stated you received credit from AP exam but is not yet in Howdy
- T: class was transferred to A&M
- T Indicates a class that you transferred to A&M but is not yet in Howdy
- Courses denoted by a handwritten * are courses recommended for your next semester



DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

ICD & CD Requirement Texas A&M requires that all students complete a 3 hour ICD course and a 3 hour CD course outside of the 120 degree hours.

Core Curriculum 45 hours

Provides a well rounded foundation for your education in 7 different targeted areas. EVERY student at TAMU must complete the core curriculum regardless of major

Each student at Texas A&M is required to complete two writing intensive courses prior to graduation. These are already built into your degree (SPMT 265 & 470)

Writing Intensive 7 hours



COURSE SEQUENCING

- Sport management major courses, on the Sport Management degree, must be taken in a specific order
- Meaning students must plan to complete SPMT specific courses in order from 200s to 300s to 400s
- This will create a "cohort" of students that will take courses together from now through graduation
- SPMT Course Sequencing is as follows:
 - SPMT 260 & 270 must be taken together
 - SPMT 260 is a prerequisite for SPMT 262
 - SPMT 270 is a prerequisite for SPMT 272
 - o SPMT 262 & 272 must be taken together
 - o SPMT 260, 270, ENGL 104, & COMM 203 are prerequisites for SPMT 265
 - 200 level SPMT courses are prerequisites for <u>ALL</u> 300 level SPMT courses
 - o 300 level SPMT courses are prerequisites for <u>ALL</u> 400 level SPMT courses

CULMINATING EXPERIENCES

- Each student will choose one of four culminating experiences that they will complete throughout their junior & senior year
- SPMT 295 will provide an introduction to each culminating experience and walk students through which option would best suit them and how to set them up
- SPMT 481 or 402 will be the course students take after an experience is assigned in which culminating experience courses and/or requirements will be approved by SPMT faculty
- The four options are:
 - Capstone
 - Internship/Field Experience
 - International Program/Study Abroad
 - Research

ELECTIVES

- Students must choose from a specific list of courses in the degree plan packet to fulfill the elective requirement of the degree
- If a student is interested in obtaining a faculty approved minor, they can utilize these hours to do so
 - o 15 hours may not cover the entire minor, so students may still have to take additional hours to obtain the minor
 - Example: The business minor requires 18 hours, so a student could use their 15 elective hours and only need an additional 3 hours for the minor
- There are some electives that can be transferred in from other institutions, for a list of those you can also refer to the degree plan packet
