Personal safety

- Buddy system (especially at night)
- Corps Escort
 Program
- Party Smart!

Securing your property

- Lock doors and windows at home and in your car
- Secure your belongings on campus

Transportation safety

- Understand the rules of the road
- Look out for others
- Wear a helmet! (Please.)

Other Important Local Laws

Noise

 Should not be audible outside the home, especially from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Trash

- Containers in street only 12 hours before/after collection
- Request extra container at minimal monthly cost if needed

No Parking

- On the lawn
- Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant
- On wrong side of the street
- Within 20 feet of a crosswalk


