Keep this workbook handy throughout your NSC, and use it to engage with the presentations and take notes.



Student Life's New Student and Family Programs (NSFP) assists new undergraduate students as they transition to Texas A&M while supporting families of all undergraduate students. NSFP serves as a campus leader in providing students and families a foundation to the expectations, academic standards, and a sense of belonging at Texas A&M. We build collaboration between students, families, and the institution for the common goals of student learning, development, and success.

What we do:

- **New Student Conferences (NSC):** The mandatory orientation for all incoming undergraduate students **newaggie.tamu.edu**
- Howdy Week: Aggieland's official welcome held at the beginning of the fall semester, for new and returning students to become acquainted with campus howdyweek.tamu.edu
- **Family Weekend:** A weekend dedicated to Aggie parents and family members that began in 1919 and provides students a chance to express their gratitude to those who have impacted their lives **familyweekend.tamu.edu**
- Aggie Parent and Family Programs: Keeping family members informed about university activities through the Aggie Parent and Family Connection portal (see below), webchats, and various publications <u>familyprograms.tamu.edu</u>

Student Leadership

- Orientation Leaders (OLs): A select group of dedicated student leaders who assist in welcoming new students and families to Aggieland during NSCs
- Aggie Parent and Family Ambassadors (APFA): Student leaders dedicated to selflessly serving Aggie family members by providing exceptional Aggie family experiences and assisting with Family Weekend, Parents of the Year, communication, and outreach
- NSCs en Español (NSCE): A group of bilingual student leaders that offers translation of our NSC presentations and materials, and support Spanish-speaking families throughout the NSC process newaggie.tamu.edu/es

TEXAS A&M CORPS OF CADETS

Founded alongside Texas A&M in 1876, the Corps of Cadets stands as the university's oldest, largest and most recognizable student organization. Today, members of the Corps are known as the Keepers of the Spirit and the Guardians of Tradition, and live at the heart of all of Texas A&M's unique traditions.

Though this four-year leadership development program is deeply rooted in its traditional, military based cultural model, **military service is entirely optional.** In fact, around 60% of graduating cadets go on to work in the public, private and nonprofit sectors. The other 40% of cadets commission into the Armed Forces and help Texas A&M uphold its status as the largest producer of military officers outside of the service academies.

Students in the Corps have exclusive access to a variety of resources, including Corps specific scholarships and academic advising. From day one, cadets are provided with the tools they need to learn, lead and inspire at every level. No matter who you are, where you're from, or what you hope to achieve in the future, the Corps of Cadets is an excellent place to develop personally and professionally.

FINANCIAL MATTERS TRADITIONS & YELL

TUITION RATE PLANS

Tuition Locked Rate (TLR): Locks in the amount of tuition and required fees at a per semester rate for 12 consecutive semesters after high school. *Resident Students Only*

Tuition Variable Rate (TVR): Amount of tuition and fees can vary from year to year based on different economic factors. *Resident and Non-Resident Students*

Calculated Locked Rate: Locks in the amount of tuition and required fees that was in effect the first term of enrollment in college. *Transfer and Re-Admit Students Only*

BILLING & PAYMENT

Tuition Calculator & Cost of Attendance: The Tuition Calculator provides as estimated cost of attendance. These calculations are dynamic based on selections such as student type, tuition rate plan, residency, and hours enrolled.

Bill Payment Suite: Find your Bill Payment Suite in your Howdy portal. Review tuition and fee bill, make payments, set up/manage refund preferences, and add/manage your authorized users.

Payment Options: You can either pay your tuition in full or sign up for a payment plan. Payment plans require a non-refundable \$50 service fee. Failure to pay on-time may result in late fees and/or loss of access to courses.

AGGIE ONE STOP

- Records & Registration: Find important academic dates, know your course options, and find resources to help you with registration.
- **Scholarships & Financial Aid:** Financial assistance is available in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, and military education benefits.
- Payments & Billing: Transparent, affordable academic costs and fast, easy ways to pay your student bill.
- Military Education Benefits: Scholarships & Financial Aid processes and certifies education benefit eligibility for VA Chapter Benefits, the Hazlewood Exemption, and the Texas Armed Services Scholarship.

AUTHORIZED USERS:

- Students are able to add and manage Authorized Users (AU) access to their student billing account. An email is sent to the AU to setup their account login.
- AU are able to view bills and make payments to student bill.
- Multiple AUs can be granted access to the account.

Texas A&M's traditions unite our current and former students, build camaraderie, and foster the Aggie Spirit. Our traditions are part of Aggie life, including how we greet each other, what words we use, and what we do on gamedays. Below are just a few of the traditions that capture the Aggie Spirit. Check out **tx.ag/NSCTraditions**.

AGGIE CULTURE

- · Howdy The official greeting of Texas A&M University. It is our way of ensuring that no one feels like a stranger.
- Gig 'Em Aggies will often flash a thumbs up and say "Gig 'em!". It signals optimism, determination, loyalty, and the Aggie Spirit.
- Big Event provides students with the opportunity to say, "Thank You" to the community. This is the largest one-day student-run service project in the nation.

GAMEDAY

- Aggie Band The Fightin' Texas Aggie Band is Texas A&M's official marching band.
- 12th Man The power of the 12th Man is demonstrated in the unity, loyalty, and willingness to serve when called to do so
- · Reveille Reveille is known as the First Lady of Aggieland and is Texas A&M's official mascot.
- Midnight Yell The night before each home football game, Aggies head to Kyle Field for Midnight Yell to get hyped up for gameday and practice yells.

REMEMBRANCE

- Aggie Muster A tradition unique to Texas A&M University that embodies and perpetuates the Aggie Spirit.
 Muster is observed worldwide each year on April 21 to remember fallen Aggies.
- Silver Taps A final tribute is held the first Tuesday of the month when a current student has passed away the previous month.
- Bonfire Memorial celebrates the tradition, history, and spirit of Texas A&M and the dedication of those involved in the tragic collapse of the 1999 Bonfire.



YELL LEADERS

For over 100 years, the Yell Leaders have embodied the unique Aggie Spirit for which Texas A&M is so well known. The Yell Leaders are comprised of five students that are elected by the student body. They are the official spirit organization of the university and they lead Aggie fans in "yells" during athletic and other university events. Unlike cheerleaders, the Yell Leaders do not perform gymnastic feats. Instead they use a variety of hand signals, called "pass backs", to direct and intensify the crowd.



Duo adds an extra layer of security to Texas A&M NetID accounts. With Duo multi-factor authentication, NetID accounts are protected with something you know (a password) and something you have (a Duo-enrolled device -typically a mobile phone). Visit it.tamu.edu/duo or scan the QR code.	
Set up Password Recovery	
Password Recovery allows you to reset your NetID password on your own if you forget it. Simply provide an email address or mobile phone number in advance.
