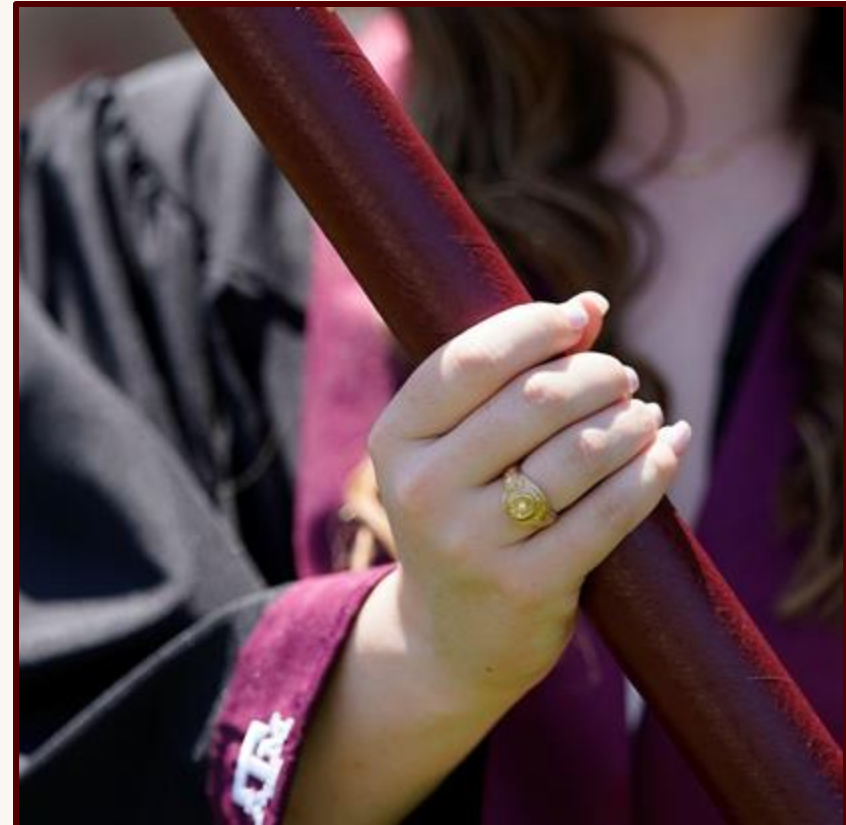

- Complete 14 hours of a foreign language through the intermediate level. If you choose to enroll in a language you have studied previously without receiving college credit, you must first take a placement test.

General Electives cannot be fulfilled using an ECON or ECMT class

Residency: At least 36 credit hours of 300 or 400-level coursework must be completed at Texas A&M or through an approved study abroad program. A minimum of 12 of these 36 credit hours must be in the major.

University Foreign Language: At least 2 semesters of college-level foreign language OR 2 years of the same foreign language in high school are required.

Writing-intensive Coursework: 6 hours of approved [UWRT] coursework are required. ECON 100-499 or ECMT 100-499 with the UWRT attribute.

International & Cultural Diversity (IUCD) and Cultural Discourse (IUCD): one course with a designation of IUCD and one course with IUCD must be factored into your degree plan

- Can be fulfilled through:
 - AP credit
 - Transfer coursework

Department Graduation Requirements

- A grade of “C” or higher is required for all ECON and ECMT courses
- ECON Major GPA area must be 2.0 or higher
- Cumulative GPA must be 2.0 or higher
- Must meet all requirements on Degree Evaluation, including:
 - 36 hours of 300 - 400 level courses taken at Texas A&M
 - 2 years of high school foreign language or 2 semesters of the same foreign language in college
 - 2 courses with the writing intensive designation [900 section]
- ***Economics Majors are required to take at least one Economics [ECON] or Econometrics [ECMT] course each fall and spring semester***

Department Expectations Recap



UINs must be included in all emails to faculty and staff



You are expected to check and read emails **regularly** from your **official Texas A&M email**



Economics, Econometrics, and Mathematics Courses **must** be completed with a grade of C or higher to apply to your degree



It is highly encouraged that you meet with your advisor regularly. Not doing so could lead to delays in graduation.



Students are responsible for knowing and following **all** college, department and university policies.

Math Placement Exam

- Math Placement Exam is **NOT** a credit granting test
- Despite how high your score is, you must still take 2 math courses
 - Even if you earned a “perfect” score
- The **only way** to satisfy your math requirements:
 - AP Credit
 - Dual Credit
 - Transfer Credit
 - Taking them at A&M
- If you scored a 22 or higher, please see **Shelby** after we are done

Creating a Schedule

- 12 hours is the minimum for full-time status
 - A typical freshman schedule is 13 - 16 hours
- You may not be able to follow the catalog's 4-year plan exactly
 - Course credit could already be earned
 - Some courses may not have open seats or may not be offered this semester
- Do not register for a course in which you believe you have AP or transfer credit
- Your options for online courses while completing your ECON degree at Texas A&M will be very **LIMITED**

"When I applied to TAMU, Finance was my first choice major but I only got into Economics and was worried I wasn't going to like it.

However, **I did very well in the class** (despite it being online) and I'm now **excited** to further my economics knowledge and am confident this is the right career path for me."

"Two main takeaways I had:

1. **You can learn a lot more from an online course than you might expect** if you apply yourself and have a solid professor like Dr. Meer!
2. Economics is far more applicable than a bunch of confusing charts that the average person can't interpret."

"I honestly was a little worried because of the ECON 202 rumors, but **it has turned out to be one of my favorite classes.**
