- 2 courses within Major Area of Study
- Must be designated as "Writing Intensive" in the term taken
   Residence Requirement
- 36 hours of upper-level classes (300/400 level) taken at Texas A&M

# ENHANCING YOUR DEGREE


### Adding Requirements to Degree Completion:

- Minors
  - Up to 2, generally before 90 hours (some programs sooner)
- Certificates
  - Additional program, can apply to primary degree requirements
- Second Major, Double Degree
  - Before 90 hours, with additional requirements
- Bachelors/Masters Combined Programs
  - English, History, & Philosophy programs






