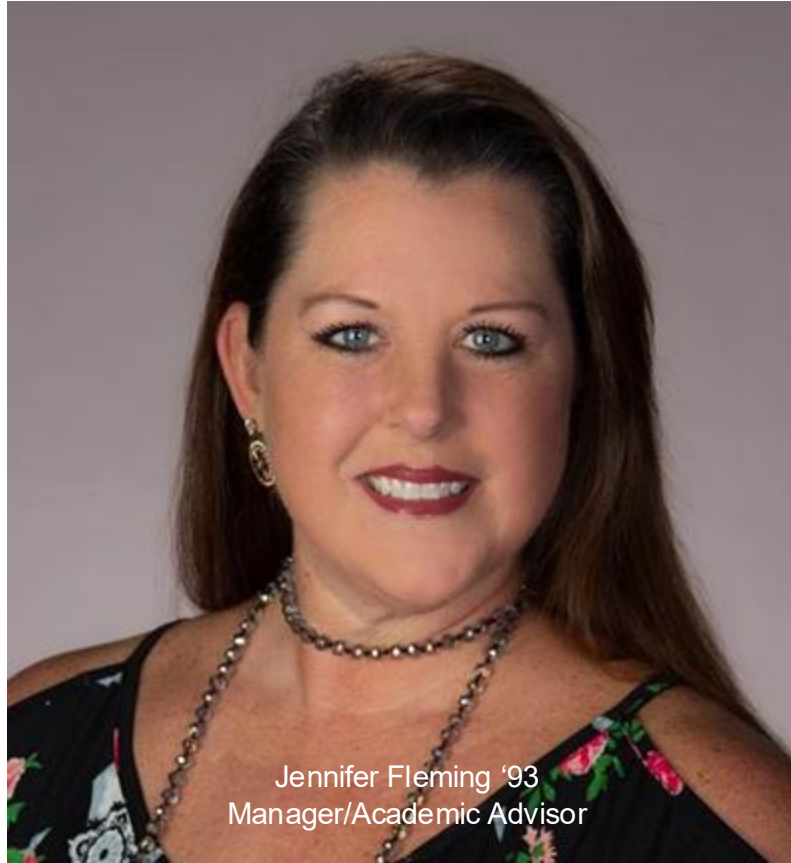

What to Expect from my Advisor

Monitor my academic progress, help me solve academic problems, and offer suggestions/recommendations.

Direct me to resources on campus (ex. OPSCA, Career Center, Disability Resources, etc...).

To review my chosen classes during each registration period, understanding advisors will not choose my courses because this is my degree.

Encourage me to take responsibility for my academic choices and help me develop decision-making skills.

What my Advisor Expects from Me

Read my emails for important information distributed by advisors and respond accordingly from my tamu.edu email with my UIN.

To take initiative and be responsible for my academic career. Advisors provide guidance, but ultimate responsibility for my academic choices rest on me.

Know the academic calendar and important dates and deadlines every semester. Understand that rules and deadlines must be adhered to.

Know how to generate and read my degree evaluation and monitor my progress every semester.

You Are a BA/BS PSYCHOLOGY Major or NRSC-BCN Major

As you start your Fall 2025 semester, please understand you entered TAMU as a Psychology or NRSC-BCN Major.

If you plan on changing your major, we cannot advise you. You must speak with an advisor from your interested major (BIMS, BIOL, KINE etc).

As PBSI advisors, we can ONLY advise on a BS Behavioral and Cognitive Neuroscience and BS/BA Psychology degrees.

Until you change majors, you ARE a NRSC-BCN or PSYC student and must register accordingly.

FERPA LAWS

***Certificate of Dependency form** - must be signed and on file to give your parent/guardian access to your educational record. This is **NOT** the same as "Parent access via Howdy portal".

You MUST complete 36 hours of upper-level coursework (300/400 level) at Texas A&M to graduate!

Hullabaloo U – PBSI 105

- Texas A&M's first-year experience course for ***Freshmen* (PBSI 105, sections 502-517)**
- Some students who are recipients of a specific scholarship, in a learning community, or the Corps of Cadets will have a specific Hullabaloo U “*cohort*” assigned to them by that community (ex. LBAR, SOMS, etc....). This should have been provided to you. You will still need PBSI 105 as well.
- Mandatory for incoming **FRESHMEN (PSYC and NRSC-BCN)** Fall 2025 semester

COURSE and SECTION

Do's and Don't's

ex: PBSI 301 501

Subj Course Section

300-499 COURSE numbers are Residency

- (you can take these if you meet pre-reqs & restrictions)

200-299 SECTION numbers are HONORS

- (you must be in a HONORS program NOW)

598, 599 and 700 SECTIONS are ONLINE

- (CHECK FEES)

You CANNOT register for:

- *600-699 **COURSE** numbers (graduate students)
- *Any **SECTION** beginning with M (McAllen courses)

Reminders

1. Have your degree evaluation handy when planning your Fall 2025 schedule (provided at dept meeting).
2. You will NOT be able to register if any Holds are still on your account.
3. Make sure you sign your Action Items: LAB SAFETY AGREEMENT, TERMS OF USE, AND LOCATION UPDATE (use zip code 77843). These Action Items will be done every semester.
4. When searching courses, make sure to view the prerequisite and restriction tabs in Schedule Builder.
5. Be mindful of online courses “section fees”.
6. It is IMPERATIVE that you read ALL emails from PBSI Advisors.
7. You must include your UIN and Full Name in your email or you won't get a response.
