


Online 50% Rule

All College of Education and Human Development Degrees are traditional face-to-face bachelor's degree programs. Since these are not distance education programs students cannot take more than 50% (60 credit hours) of their required courses online. This applies to Texas A&M University coursework and does not include courses taken at other institutions. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) rules that no more than 50% of courses can be taken online if the program is not approved to be offered online as a distance education program.




- Sport management major courses, on the Sport Management degree, must be taken in a specific order
- Meaning students must plan to complete SPMT specific courses in order from 200s to 300s to 400s
- This will create a "cohort" of students that will take courses together from now through graduation
- SPMT Course Sequencing is as follows:
 - SPMT 260 & 270 must be taken together
 - SPMT 260 is a prerequisite for SPMT 262
 - o SPMT 270 is a prerequisite for SPMT 272
 - SPMT 262 & 272 must be taken together
 - SPMT 260, 270, ENGL 104, & COMM 203 are prerequisites for SPMT 265
 - 200 level SPMT courses are prerequisites for <u>ALL</u> 300 level SPMT courses
 - o 300 level SPMT courses are prerequisites for **ALL** 400 level SPMT courses

CULMINATING EXPERIENCES

- Each student will choose one of four culminating experiences that they will complete throughout their junior & senior year
- SPMT 295 will provide an introduction to each culminating experience and walk students through which option would best suit them and how to set them up
- SPMT 481 or 402 will be the course students take after an experience is assigned in which culminating experience courses and/or requirements will be approved by SPMT faculty
- The four options are:
- Capstone
- Internship/Field Experience
- International Program/Study Abroad
- Research

ELECTIVES

- Students must choose from a specific list of courses in the degree plan packet to fulfill the elective requirement of the degree
- If a student is interested in obtaining a faculty approved minor, they can utilize these hours to do so
 - 15 hours may not cover the entire minor, so students may still have to take additional hours to obtain the minor
 - Example: The business minor requires 18 hours, so a student could use their 15 elective hours and only need an additional 3 hours for the minor
- There are some electives that can be transferred in from other institutions, for a list of those you can also refer to the degree plan packet
