Classics

Classics is designed to give students a thorough **grounding in the culture, history, literature of Ancient Greece and Rome**. Studying the language, history, literature, and architecture of these civilizations develops student skills in close reading, writing, and critical thinking. Students examine and analyze ancient cultures and learn about how fundamental concepts of Western Civilization such as rationalism and democracy first arose in Classical Antiquity.

Global Studies

Global Studies is a humanities-oriented major emphasizing cultural literacy. It prepares students to take on global challenges in a workforce that needs people who can speak with nuance, clarity, and confidence. The study of languages and cultures makes way for understanding of domestic and foreign issues through literature, film, media, arts, and built environments. Courses focus on making connections across human and natural systems, and how people experience the cultures they live in.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND RESOURCES

- **Residency Requirement:** all students must take 36 hours of upper-level classes (*course numbers 300 to 499*)
 - 12 of those hours must be in your major
 - The other 24 may come from anywhere on the degree
- **Writing intensive requirement:** 2 major courses must be Writing Intensive
- **Major courses = MAJOR COURSEWORK**
 - Cannot be used towards core or general electives
- **Course Catalog: catalog.tamu.edu**
 - Your catalog year will always be yours (2025-2026 will be your year)

International Experience Requirements

1. You must spend a **minimum of 10 consecutive weeks** in an approved study abroad, internship or volunteer (service-learning) experience. This could be completed during the fall, spring or summer. Your IE must have a cultural and/or language immersion component based on the language in which you will have proficiency.
2. You must be in good academic standing with the university.
3. For GLST majors, you must complete (or test out of) **101 and 102** of language and **GLST 201**. You must earn a grade of “C” or better in each of these courses. For MODL-GERM and SPAN majors, you must complete (or test out of) 101-202.
4. Your IE must generate a minimum of 3 hours of approved academic credit.
5. Once approved for travel by the GLAC advising office, it is your responsibility to follow Texas A&M procedures for study abroad and transfer credit. In most cases this is done under the direction of the Study Abroad Office located in the Pavilion.
6. Experiences abroad prior to the completion of these requirements will not satisfy the IE requirement.

Transfer Courses

There are 3 different ways courses can appear on your Texas A&M transcript:

- Direct Transfer
 - These courses have been deemed equivalent to an existing TAMU course.
- Transfer by Title
 - These courses may be equivalent to a TAMU course, but additional information is needed in order to be used in your degree.
- Non-Transferable
 - These courses are not equivalent and cannot be used to satisfy a TAMU course.
