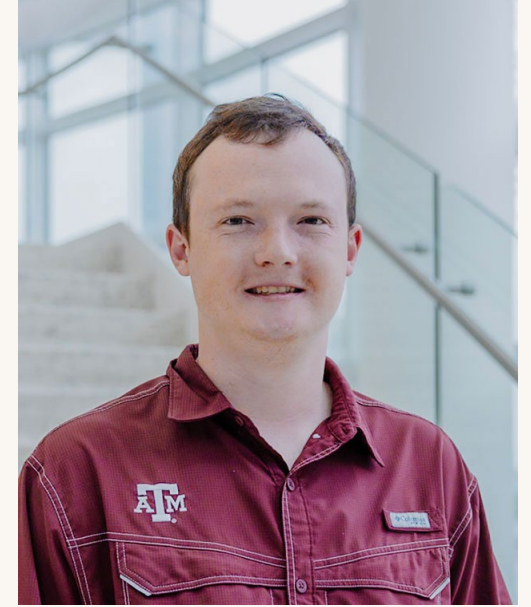




Advising Staff and Roles

Undergraduate advising staff: roles

- Assist you in navigating to the successful completion of your degree
- Answer questions about transfer courses
- Advise on course load (not determine your schedule)
- Make recommendations for help at your request



Email, Academic Policies, and Expectations

Email

- The TAMU email account is the primary method of communication between students and the university
- Students are responsible for all information conveyed via their university email account
- Read all emails sent by your advisor
- Don't forward your university email to another account
- Check your university account on a *daily* basis (if not more often)
- Notify your advisor if you do not get emails from that person

Academic policies

- Degree planners are to be submitted by September 30 (once a year unless otherwise specified)
- Student are required to earn a C or better in all CHEN classes (plus some others)
- Students have two attempts (including dropped classes) to successfully complete a CHEN course
- Probation policies
- Dismissal

Transition to Texas A&M
